CALL 911



TURN THEM TO THE SIDE.

STAY WITH THEM.

WAIT UNTIL HELP ARRIVES. TELL EMERGENCY PERSONNEL WHAT YOU KNOW ABOUT THEIR DRINKING AND CONDITION.



KEEP THEM AWAKE.

IF POSSIBLE, KEEP THEM TALKING, EVEN IF IT'S INCOHERENT.



NO MORE SUBSTANCES.

DO YOUR BEST TO MAKE SURE THEY DON'T INGEST ANYMORE DRUGS OR ALCOHOL WHILE WAITING FOR EMERGENCY PERSONNEL.

YOU'RE PROTECTED UNDER MEDICAL AMNESTY

MEDICAL AMNESTY ALLOWS STUDENTS TO AVOID FORMAL UNIVERSITY DISCIPLINARY ACTION WHEN THEY CALL FOR HELP DURING AN ALCOHOL- OR DRUG-RELATED EMERGENCY.

STUDENTS SEEKING MEDICAL ASSISTANCE FOR THEMSELVES OR OTHERS DURING AN OVERDOSE OR EMERGENCY WILL NOT FACE LEGAL OR DISCIPLINARY CONSEQUENCES SOLELY FOR THE PERSONAL USE OR POSSESSION OF ALCOHOL OR DRUGS.



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
